

Purpose: The purpose of Bridgehaven CAC's (BCAC) first annual art contest is to promote awareness of Child Abuse Prevention Month and to give the children in our community an opportunity to express what *hope* means to them in an artistic form.

Eligibility: Child must be between the ages of 5-17 or actively enrolled in school (K-12).

Prizes: Winners will have their artwork displayed on BCAC's website, social media, and local newspapers.

Rules:

- Participants may submit one piece of original art, completed solely by the participant.
- Media allowed includes: Pen, Pencil, Marker, Paints, Oils, Charcoal, Watercolors, Canvas, and Paper.
- Artwork must be inspired by BCAC's theme: Hope.
- Artwork cannot be any larger than 3x3x3.
- Artwork must have description label attached.
- Participants may, in 100 words or less, describe how the artwork is representative of the theme: Hope.
- Artwork is subject for use by BCAC. If a participant would like their artwork returned to them, they must note so on the label and BCAC will schedule a single time with administrators to drop off artwork.
- Artwork must be submitted to BCAC by April 17, 2023.
